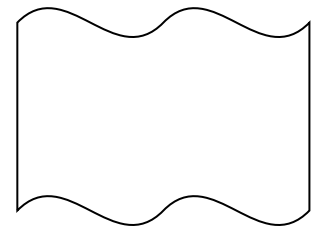

DOING GOOD DEEDS

I Good deeds are acts of kindness. They often involve people contributing* their time and energy to the residents* of the community. These good people want to do something significant*-something that helps others and makes the world a better place. Here are a few examples of good deeds that are being done around the world.

II At the request of teachers at high school in Sanger, Texas, a minimarket has been opened to provide for needy* students and their families." Forty-three percent of students in our community are poor," claims the school's principal." We thought it was important to support them and their families and make sure that they had food on the table." Rather than paying cash for essential* food items, families use a point system to buy goods. The number of points they get depends on the size of the family. Students are also encouraged to earn extra points by doing good deeds.

III In a program developed by the mayor of London, British businessmen prepare 16-18 -year- olds for future employment and life. In return, the teen participants volunteer in their community. More than 50 percent of the participants reported that volunteering has changed their attitude toward beings in general and themselves in particular. It has increased their trust in people and helped them connect to their community.

IV Nadav Weiss and a number of his friends from Jerusalem got together and created the "Doing Good Map" online. Within a week, they were amazed to find about 200 good deeds on their website from Israel and many foreign countries. People reported about organizing online art classes (Greece), contributing to a hospital (Italy), helping elderly citizens (the USA) and repairing a home for at risk teenagers (Israel).
